# Orientation at a glance

Your academic year starts with ORIENTATION. Attendance is compulsory. It will kick off with the Welcoming Ceremony and Faculty Meet & Greet on Saturday 26 January 2013 and end with the last orientation session for this initial phase on Saturday 9 February. Lectures commence on 11 February. The Orientation Academic Sessions as well as Byways to Highways will take place during the first week of lectures. The Campus Life Festival will take place two weeks later on the last Saturday in February.

First year registration takes place from Monday 28 January to Wednesday 30 January (see separate registration guide for your registration date). The orientation programme runs from 31 January to Friday 8 February and will extend into your first week of lectures. Thereafter, you will be "buddied" by your How2 buddy for the first term.

Some faculties will kick off with the Nelson Mandela Champion Within Programme, some with Bursaries and Budgets and some with Meeting your Lecturers.

On the day of your How2@nmmu Programme, you will be placed in a How2 group with a How2 buddy who will take you through a specially-designed programme of adjustment to university – have fun! Your buddy will also support you throughout the first term.

Failure to arrive timeously may prevent you from gaining the maximum benefit of orientation in preparing you for your studies.

# **Description of events**

#### **Academic events**

#### WELCOMING CEREMONY

On this day, new students and their parents are welcomed by the Vice-Chancellor (VC) Professor Derrick Swartz. The VC is the Principal or Chief Executive Officer of the university. Please take note of the venue where your faculty will meet, firstly for the welcoming ceremony and secondly, for the faculty meet and greet that follows, where refreshments will be served.

#### **FACULTY MEET AND GREET**

After the VC's welcoming address, students and parents move off to the faculty meet and greet. Carefully check the venue where your faculty will meet. Here you will be welcomed by the Dean of the faculty and be given an opportunity to meet your lecturers, who will provide you with information about your programme (course of study).

Parents are encouraged to attend these events, which offer great insight in terms of academic expectations and, in particular, registration.

NB: Each student enrols in a specific faculty. You need to check in which faculty your programme (course of study) falls.

#### MEET YOUR LECTURERS

Here, you will be addressed by the Head of Department or School (or Head of Academic Programme) in which you will be studying (faculties are divided into various schools or departments). You will also be addressed by your lecturers and informed about the textbooks required, what the course entails, course requirements, career options available and so on. An overview of the programme for your 'Meet your lecturers' meeting appears under your faculty section in this guide.

#### **HOW2@NMMU BUDDY PROGRAMME**

On the day of your How2@nmmu programme, you'll be divided into small groups of first year students doing the same course. Your group will be led by a senior student, called your How2 buddy. Your buddy will take you through a programme of academic orientation organised by the orientation staff at Student Counselling. You will learn how2 make a success of your stay at NMMU by finding out about:

- adjusting to university life successfully
- resources to help with you with finances, career decisions, health, and workshops to help you with study skills, managing your workload, etc.
- university terminology (all those acronyms!)
- your new campus you will be given a tour of the campus to orientate yourself, so you don't miss your first lecture!
- using the library this is a must for academic success
- ▶ how to log onto your e-mail, using the student portal and finding your notes online



- your timetable
- challenges you may face in your course and how to overcome them

Your How2 buddy will "buddy" you for the first term, helping you adjust to life at university. You will meet informally once every fortnight over lunch or coffee to chat about your concerns and challenges. Your How2 buddy will also be available to you via e-mail, Facebook, and BBM or MXit to find out how you are doing, and to support you in any way.

#### STUDENT - STAFF FUN EVENT

At this event, you will have some fun with your lecturers and get to know them better — and find consulting with them about your studies not such a daunting task. It will also help you develop a sense of belonging. For most faculties, this will follow immediately after your 'Meet your lecturers' meeting (check your timetable for when this event will take place).

#### NOTE-TAKING SESSIONS\*

In these sessions, you will learn how to take notes successfully in class (when you get home, you make notes and summaries of the lecture). If you think you are going to remember everything the lecturer said, you are making a mistake! Lecturers give important explanations of complex concepts and processes – you need to take notes in the lecture but you cannot write down every word the lecturer says. This session will help you to be better prepared to take accurate notes from day 1.

#### **REFERENCING AND PLAGIARISM\***

When you write assignments and essays at university, you have to acknowledge where you get your information from – you have to say whose ideas you are using. Taking other people's work and pretending that it is your own is called plagiarism – and is a serious offence! In this session, you will receive some more information in this regard.

#### **HOW TO GET THE MOST OUT OF LECTURES\***

It is not enough to simply get the notes "off the net". You have to attend the lecture! But merely sitting there like a zombie will not help you much either. This is a wonderful session to help you make the lecture work for you! It is vital to your success at university.

#### **LECTURE AND EMAIL ETIQUETTE\***

There is a required protocol for lecture behaviour and writing e-mails to staff. A huge part of receiving a higher education is to develop yourself holistically. Learning about etiquette is an important part of this development. Having good lecture etiquette will make your life and those of your lecturer and classmates better. Being considerate will assist everyone in their path to success.

Remember: It is important to consult with your lecturers to get clarity on assignments, to gain a clearer understanding of the content and requirements of the course, and also to develop your intellectual ability. Lecturers have consultation hours, usually posted on their office doors. They want you to do well. Do not hesitate to make an appointment, and have your questions ready. Your buddy will tell you more.

#### CAREER PORTFOLIO DEVELOPMENT

Here you will be shown the importance of developing your career portfolio, and how to start developing it. Just obtaining a qualification is not enough — you need to develop yourself holistically, and become a well-rounded student. You can do this by joining one of the many societies or leadership programmes on the campus, and/or finding a part-time job. The need to develop your personal, social and academic skills has become imperative (these skills are what employers are looking for — they are interested in a good qualification and the aforementioned skills). It is important that you start early on in your university career. Waiting until your final year, just before your first big job interview. is too late!

#### **MATHS REFRESHER**

(for BSc and BEng Mechatronics students only)
Given the challenges of the new school curriculum,
the Maths Refresher will provide you with a
good start to the maths module in these courses,
refreshing matric maths and bridging the gap
between high school maths and first year university
maths.

NOTE: The sessions marked with \* will be offered during lectures at the lecturers' discretion.



#### Social, cultural and sport events

#### **BYWAYS TO HIGHWAYS**

Take the highway to academic success – but travel a byway or two on your way there! No, taking byways in this case does not mean taking the long road or getting lost! The byways are the roads you travel to gain personal and leadership skills which feed into your highway to success.

Your How2 buddy will take you to the Byways to Highways societies fair - this is where all the societies and clubs have stalls showcasing their activities. Come and enjoy this fun and festive event, taking place along the main walkways of each campus. The value of your out-of-classroom experience should not be underestimated — join a society or club of your choice to enhance your university experience and start building your soft skills, imperative requirements for work in the 21st century! Come on, don't be a PCP student (parking lot — classroom — parking lot)! Get involved!

#### **CITY BUS TOUR**

For all out-of-towners! Get a grand tour of Port Elizabeth, the friendly city. See the sights, the beautiful beaches, the shopping malls, and the highways and byways of PE.

#### FIRST YEAR PICNIC

Join the SRC as they take you on a picnic – free for

all first year students. Get to socialize with other first years and meet your SRC.

**CAMPUS LIFE FESTIVAL** (last Saturday in February) This festival consists of a series of events: Campus Life concert, Rag, Societies and Clubs Expo, sports programme and the first-year social.

#### **CAMPUS LIFE CONCERT**

What good is sitting alone in your room? Come hear the music play!

Most of you are probably too young to know this song by Liza Minnelli. Nevertheless, come and showcase your talent! Can you sing, dance, play a musical instrument, recite poetry or perform magic? The Campus Life concert is a huge event. If you are just going to watch, be there early as this event is jam-packed!

At the end of this day, join the party at the first year social. Relax and let your hair down.




#### Looking ahead

Services currently available include recording of study materials, special work areas in the libraries equipped with magnification software, and a vehicle to assist with specific transportation needs.

As every case needs to be individually assessed, please register your special needs with the university's Senior Disability Officer, Ms Ruth Barends, as soon as possible, preferably the year prior to registration and application. At your first appointment you will need to provide medical documentation from an appropriate professional. The goal of the consultations between students and the Disability Office is to identify the impact of disability on students and to maximise opportunities for your independent participation.

## **Transport**

#### BY PLANE

**Airport:**The Port Elizabeth airport is about a ten minute drive from the main campus. You can get to NMMU by cab or shuttle. There is no bus or mini-bus service from the airport.

#### Cab services:

### **BY BUS**

**Bus station:** The main long distance bus services travelling to Port Elizabeth are Translux, Greyhound, Intercape and Roadlink. They all stop at or close to Greenacres Shopping Centre. You can travel from Greenacres to NMMU with Algoa Bus Service, the city's public bus service, or by cab or mini-bus taxi.

#### **PUBLIC BUS SERVICE**

Algoa Bus Service: 041 404 1200 or 080 142 1444 (free call for timetable information). A public bus service runs from Virgin Active (opposite Greenacres in Ring Road) to NMMU. The buses run daily, except Sundays, from 08:25 to 18:15 to NMMU, but more frequently in the morning. The name at the front of the bus will read NMMU or number 0. It costs R10.00 to travel from Greenacres to NMMU.

#### CAR

See telephone numbers under Airport information.

#### **MINIBUS TAXI**

The minibus taxi services run from Greenacres (outside Mr Price), between 08:00 and 18:00. They will transport you to the city centre (Norwich terminal), where you transfer to a taxi that will take you to the university. Because of the change over, this service is not recommended for a first-time

visitor. It costs R6.00 to travel from Greenacres to the city centre, and a further R8,00 to travel from town to NMMU.

#### BY TRAIN

**Train station:** The Algoa Bus Service (see above), as well as the minibus taxi service runs from the Norwich Terminal across the road from the train station. Alternatively, you can take a cab. For cab numbers, see Airport information.

Please note: Like in any big city, travel after dark is not recommended. During the day, students are advised to take care of their belongings. If arriving by train, it is advisable to stay inside the station until your cab arrives.







## Eating in, eating out

#### FOOD ON THE MOVE

All the major fast food outlets can be found at various points in Nelson Mandela Bay, but there is a drivethrough McDonald's in Beach Road, Summerstrand. 




## Inter-campus map
